





Addiction and drug use is a problem everywhere across the United States and we take these issues seriously at Marimn Health. This issue is at the top of our minds for those of us who have family and friends in our community impacted by drug use.

We are removing barriers to get people into treatment. We have also started several new programs to help those in our community break the difficult cycle of addiction.

#### **Medication- Assisted Treatment Program**

We recently started a Medication-Assisted Treatment (MAT) program to help those in our community who are battling addiction. Our MAT team develops an individualized plan for each patient, beginning with a monthly injectable medication received at the clinic to alleviate withdrawal symptoms. Patients attend individual counseling sessions and group meetings to help build skills for a healthier life without drugs or alcohol. The program can coordinate traditional treatment options such as medical detox, inpatient treatment, and transitional housing.

We also have a specialized MAT service for pregnant women and new mothers struggling with addiction or in recovery. The Emerge

Program provides medical care, support, and resources during pregnancy and for up to 15 months after the baby is born. Dr. Kate Aguirre and Behavioral Health Clinician Angie Delio are teaming up to run this program in-house at Marimn Health.

### **Community Healing and Wellness**

**Boys & Girls Club Statistics**: Fall 2018

Enrolled in Boys & Girls Club • 135 CDA Tribal members • 105 Other Tribes • 16

Boys & Girls Clubs of America has been working in Indian Country for more than 25 years. Today, Boys & Girls Clubs of America is the nation's largest youth services provider for native youth. In fact, they serve 114 Tribal communities with 200 Native Boys & Girls Clubs across the nation. These Native Clubs serve 90,000 youth each year, opening doors to opportunities for each child who participates in a Club.

We rolled out our very own Boys & Girls Club programs in fall of 2017 on Friday and Saturday evenings. In 2018, we expanded our programs to 5 nights per week. Up until this point, the friendly staff at the Boys & Girls Club of Kootenai County have provided training and operational support to our employees for free while we work through the process of establishing our own club.

However, our Boys & Girls Club programs have always been directly run by our very own employees at the Wellness Center - led by LoVina Louie and Jaycee Goudy - members of our reservation community. Jaycee, along with Coeur d'Alene Tribal Member Imani Antone and the rest of the Youth Programs Staff are doing a wonderful job ensuring tribal culture

and values are infused into the club programming. The Club gives our kids a safe place to go after school and the programs there are helping them stay away from drugs, alcohol, and crime. They provide homework help and regular physical activity. The Club curriculum increases the high school graduation rate amongst youth who are members of a Boys & Girls Club.

Children ages 6 and older can come to the Boys & Girls Club after school for homework help, structured playtime, culture, art, and mentorship. Please tell your friends, your family, and anyone who has youth who could be positively affected by joining the Boys & Girls Club. Registration is available at the Wellness Center.

Coming home can be hard for those returning to our community after inpatient treatment or after being incarcerated. That's why Marimn Health and the Coeur d'Alene Tribe created a Reentry Program to help community members re-integrate into the community in a healthy way.

Reentry coaches advocate for clients and families. They can also break down barriers that may arise when settling back into the community. The Reentry Team will meet clients when they finish treatment or are released and will walk beside them until they are healthy.

Coaches have thorough knowledge of the services available through the Tribe and Marimn Health. They can connect people to resources and reduce obstacles to health and wellness. The Reentry Team works with courts, social services, behavioral health, medical, education, employment, and others to provide the resources to address each individual's needs.

Steven Moffitt is the Reentry Program Manager. Brianna Louie and Corrina Hendrickx joined the Reentry Program as Reentry coaches. They receive additional support from Ryan Ortivez who provides recovery coaching, peer support services, and patient advocacy services as a part of the Behavioral Health team.

Marimn Health has a team of **Patient Relationship Coordinators** led by Dee Janson. She and her staff are here to ensure your experience here is the best it can be. This year we added more equipment and exam rooms in **optical** to reduce the wait. This allows us to see more patients each day.

Our transportation department is growing! For many years, we have offered rides to appointments at Marimn Health. In 2018, we began transporting patients to specialist appointments off the reservation. Transportation is also available for our patients who are participating in our MAT Program and Reentry Program.

We began offering **podiatry** last April. Dr. Brent Clark helped almost 300 patients with their foot pain last year and he will see even more in 2019.

THE FUTURE

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In the fall of 2018, the Coeur d'Alene Tribal Council gave the approval for Marimn Health to build a new Youth and Family Recreation Center on tribal land near Worley, Idaho. The primary goal for the new building is to give the youth and families on the reservation a safe place to gather, learn, and have fun.

"There are many important needs in our community, but none more pressing than preserving and protecting the health and safety of our youth. As the saying goes, an ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure, and investing in our youth is an investment in the future of the Tribe," said Ernie Stensgar, Chairman of the Coeur d'Alene Tribe.

The building includes a family waterpark with a waterslide and indoor splash pad, children's play area, lazy river, lap lanes, and water climbing wall and plunge platforms; outdoor sports fields, including a basketball court, softball/ baseball, and football fields; outdoor playground for kids and pavilion and picnic area; fitness equipment and areas; ample dedicated space for youth programs, including Boys & Girls Club programs; and child care.

The building is being designed by NAC Architects and has a preliminary budget of approximately \$15.8 million. The facility will be owned and operated by the Tribe and Marimn Health. We expect to break ground on the building in mid to late 2019.



"This is a major step toward our mission to create lasting change in the overall health of our community," said Helo Hancock, CEO of Marimn Health. "I have no doubt that this investment in prevention for the youth of our reservation will positively impact the future of our entire community for generations to come."
