Wellness Center Renovations Project Update

Coming in February:

- Mezzanine expansion will begin
- The new front desk will be completed
- Restrooms near the main entrance will close for renovation
- Conference rooms will be completed

February marks a full year since the renovation work started at the Wellness Center, and nearly a full two years since the pre-construction portion of the project started. At the end of this month there will be more areas of the Wellness Center where renovations are done, than spaces that still need to be renovated - the finish line is near!

We have officially re-opened the pool, new hot tub, and the women's locker room back up for use, and the aquatic fitness classes like Aqua Zumba will return to the Wellness Center during the first week of February. Along with aesthetic upgrades to the pool, we also replaced many of the aging mechanical pieces that have been in use since the Wellness Center opened in 1998. One of the new mechanical features includes a UV light component that allows us to increase the overall sanitation of the pool while using lower amounts of chemicals to treat the water.

Before the end of the month, we will see our new front desk area open in its new location towards the front of the building near Physical Therapy. Once it's complete, patrons will check in at the new desk, rather than in the iconic *circle*. Following the opening of our new front desk, the conference rooms will be next to open up. The conference room upgrades include some much-needed audio visual updates to our projectors and sound systems, as well as a small kitchen.

Finally, the restrooms near the main entrance of the facility will close this month. The only restrooms available will be in the men's locker room, women's locker room, and family locker room.

If you've been following along with us this last year, we hope you are just as happy as we are to see these much needed updates around the building, the beautiful new additions, and the exciting fitness opportunities ahead!
